Happy Easter! I pray that the hope and joy of the resurrection filled your hearts this week. In place of "The Bugle", I'm writing today with several updates including the progress of our principal search, teacher assignments for 2024-25, and more.

Principal Search

The interview process for our next principal is well underway. The search committee has conducted interviews, and round two interviews were held this week. The team is feeling confident that your new leader will be named soon. Thank you for your ongoing prayers and support for this process.

Teaching Assignments

We will have some familiar faces returning to familiar places this fall. Ms. Emily Bilski is heading back to the second grade classroom and Mrs. Cathy Anderson will be moving back to third grade. With these changes, Ms. Hadden awaits the Lord's direction on her next assignment.

Ms. Bilski will step back into her previous placement after generously sharing her talent in the school office as Programs Director, a special assignment for this year. Ms. Bilski began her teaching career at St. Bart's in second grade and joyfully served in that role for nine years. She is eager to return.

Mrs. Anderson will "loop" to third grade, thus bringing her second graders with her.
